#### TO MOW OR NOT TO MOW

Following our recent work at several of our sites some people have contacted us concerned that we have been removing trees and scrub—about the timing and why we do it. We have a delicate balance to strike every year when we choose what time to cut the grass and hedges. It's important this gets done because otherwise our wonderful flower-rich grassland would all soon turn to scrub.

If we do it too soon, there might be a late brood of birds, and the seeds won't have set from the seed heads, whereas if we do it too late, it's so wet on many of our sites that we sink into the ground and make a mess. And on some sites, such as One Horse Field in Totland, and Pan Country Park, we have to be especially careful to ensure we don't harm slow worms.

We do agree it looks a bit severe at first, but please do bear with us. In the spring the benefits of this work should really start to show when the plants start to come back - better for the birds and insects too.

Swanmore Meadows looked a bit sorry back in October, but as these photos taken at the end of November by Gift To Nature supporter Liz Giles show, it has already started to green-up.
